CORRUPTION IN GOVERNMENT IS FAST-BECOMING A DISASTER OF EPIC PROPORTIONS FROM WHICH THE PEOPLE OF THE UNITED STATES MAY NEVER RECOVER

The Law Dictionary (Featuring Black's Law Dictionary Free Online Legal Dictionary 2nd Ed.) answers the question, "What is CORRUPTION?" like this:

Illegality; a vicious and fraudulent intention to evade the prohibitions of the law. The act of an official or fiduciary person who unlawfully and wrongfully uses his station or character to procure some benefit for himself or for another person, contrary to duty and the rights of others. U. S. v. Johnson (C. C.) 20 Fed. 082; State v. Ragsdale. 59 Mo. App. 003; Wight v. Rindskopf, 43 Wis. 351; Worsham v. Murchison, 00 Ga. 719; U. S. v. Edwards (C. C.) 43 Fed. 07.

Abraham Lincoln saw it coming a long time ago:

These are the fundamental reasons that Lincoln's admonition is so profound - and every reader should consider the following:

There is a good argument to be made that the objective of "corruption in high places" is to continue the transfer our nation's wealth to those "high places" without the interference of the "due process" rights of the people as intended by the 5th and 14th Amendments to the United States Constitution. Simply put, the top one-percent of the people can have unmerciful power and influence over government legislators and administrators that determine U.S. fiscal policy. Rest assured that fiscal policy would not favor the rich if fiscal policy was set by a process of "direct vote" by all the people (as, perhaps, Lincoln envisioned).

The lesson here is that, while the vast majority of hard working Americans are busy earning the money to provide food, clothing, and shelter for their families; the "powers-to-be" (especially the courts) are catering to the rich and powerful individuals, financial institutions and big corporations - EXACTLY as Lincoln feared would happen.

So the bottom line is this: It's all about money. Corruption has become a way of life in America. We (the bottom 99%) will suffer all the pain when they (the top 1%) get all the money. Time and time again, a key element in the coordination of an "institutional corruption" scheme is the clever removal of resistance to the corruption by and through the removal of individual due process rights. Unfortunately, it is often the judiciary that paves the way for the success of these institutional corruption schemes. This is accomplished when judges suspend the "rule of law" in order to implement "arbitrary rule."

The notion that judges are impartial is an objective but not a reality. They are human beings just like you and I. They are not computerized robots, programmed to apply laws and legal doctrines to admissible evidence with 100% statistical validity and consistency. They are political beings with their own thoughts and feelings. It is, therefore, simply not realistic for you to assume or think that a judge can abandon his or her own constitution, as the legal system would have us believe, when he or she takes a seat on the bench. Don't be disillusioned by the traditional concepts of truth, lawyers, and judges when you enter the courtroom. Be educated and prepared to protect yourself to the greatest extent possible given the circumstances. Ironically enough, it is the court judges themselves that are most likely to intentionally deny your due process rights. You may not be aware that, fundamentally, judges have what is called "judicial immunity" from being held accountable (i.e. you can't sue a judge for damages except in extraordinary circumstances) for their acts and conduct which any reasonable person would find to be blatantly illegal. This judicial immunity has been tried and has prevailed in the federal appeals courts and is here to stay! While most judges see and respect their immunity from prosecution as a means for them to exercise their discretion in a truly impartial manner (recognizing their duty to be true to the high degree of trust placed in them), many judges blatantly take advantage of their judicial immunity by ruling in favor of their personal likes and dislikes, their political agendas, and their other self-serving objectives. Obviously, justice is not, even remotely, being served when this happens. The current trend is that more and more people are finding their "day in court" to be an exercise in futility as they come face-to-face with arrogant, condescending, impolite, politically-oriented and corrupt judges. When it comes to a bad judge, the old axiom that a "rotten apple spoils the barrel" is especially apropos; as everyone in the Court that comes in contact with such a judge (i.e. attorneys, clerks, other court staff, etc.) is influenced by the horrible example set by such judges. The Due Process Advocate has received reports of, literally, hundreds of inexcusably reprehensible acts and conduct committed by those who are most trusted to preserve and protect the constitutionally-protected right to due process.

Therefore, please do NOT allow your due process rights to be pushed aside because some so-called "government official" (especially a judge) thinks that their job is more important than your "life, liberty, or property." Be polite, be respectful, but make it clear that you take due process very seriously. Don't be the pawn in a political agenda or scheme that thrives on the removal of your due process rights. Don't be afraid to challenge a position that you know is legally wrong.

Instead, help expose the corruption we see and experience every day - before it's just too late. Unless we bring an end to the corruption at all levels of government operations, it won't be long before our nation's debt is unsustainable, our nation's infrastructure is beyond repair, our nation's security is permanently compromised, affordable healthcare is an illusion, and the America Dream has disappeared for most Americans.
