EVEN HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ARE LEARNING FIRST-HAND THE DANGERS OF ARBITRARY RULE BURIED IN THE FINE PRINT


One major objective of The Due Process Advocate is to expose the devastating effects of "arbitrary rule" (i.e. authorities making rules based on personal views and political agendas instead of the law) that have become commonplace in so many government agencies and institutions across the country.

For example, each and every day, Americans are exposed to a mine-field of transactions and activities where their due process rights can suddenly become absolutely critical. They might be making a major purchase (like buying a car or a house), entering into a business deal, working in a hostile work environment, receiving a medical treatment, filing an insurance claim, borrowing or investing money, getting stopped by the police, going to court, and - yes - even attending a public high school.

All of these activities can involve a mountain of fine print that is often never read, much less understood, and attending a high school is certainly no exception. A typical student handbook contains a mind-boggling number of directives, policies, procedures, rules, requirements, and standards that cover everything imaginable that might occur in the life of a student from the time that student leaves home in the morning and arrives home at night.

In comparison to the slightly more than 7500 total number of words in the U.S. Constitution (including all its Amendments), a typical student handbook for a high school of 1000 to 2000 students might have, literally, tens of thousands of words!

The problem is simply that a high school student would have to be a legal scholar to determine which policies and procedures are arbitrarily imposed on the entire student population and not grounded in law.
